Your "Why" is critical!

It needs to sustain you in tough times

Ask yourself:

- Do I have a passion for this work?
- Do I enjoy using the skills required for this work?
- Do I see an unmet need in the marketplace?



Successful entrepreneurs have these traits

- Passionate about what they do
- Willing to listen and learn
- Hard working, independent, goal oriented
- Flexible and inquisitive
- Problem solver
- Resilient



Do you have industry experience?

Ask yourself:

What jobs have I had in this industry?

What relevant skills do I have?

How will I fill in the gaps?



What business skills do you have?

- Financial management
- Marketing
- Customer relations
- Technology, software
- People Management



What will be the financial impact?

- Understand your personal finances
- Determine if extra income impacts your benefits
- Prepare a financial projection before making the leap



What's your support system?

Where will you get business advice?

 Who/what will provide you with emotional support?

 Who will back you up if you are unable to work?



What is business planning?

 A systematic way of investigating if your business idea will work

- It can take many forms
 - Full written plan
 - One page "lean" plan
 - Pitch deck
 - Even a map



Why is it important?

"If you fail to plan, you plan to fail"

- Business planning helps you avoid common pitfalls
 - Assumptions about demand
 - Cash flow problems
 - Marketing missteps

Required by banks and investors

- Your timeline to launch
- Your future goals

Your Numbers

- Your startup costs
- An estimate of your expected revenue
- A budget for your expenses
- Your estimated profit

What is the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation?

 A State of Maine agency that assists individuals with disabilities to prepare for, find, keep and advance in integrated and competitive employment.

Provides services to:

 Transition aged students 14–24 including potentially eligible adults seeking an employment outcome

What are the eligibility requirements?

Our policy states that a person is eligible for services if she or he:

Has a physical or mental impairment, or a significant visual impairment which results in a substantial impediment to employment;

And

Requires Vocational Rehabilitation services to prepare for, secure, retain, regain or advance in employment.

How do you apply for services?

Go to the Maine <u>Division of Vocational</u>
Rehabilitation or <u>Division for the Blind</u>
and <u>Visually Impaired</u> website and
download/submit an application online

Or...

Contact a local office to request an application

How does it work?

Individualized Plan for Employment

Clients work with their Counselor to identify an employment goal based on:

- Interests, skills, and abilities
- Labor market conditions
- Barriers and needed accommodations
- Comprehensive Assessment of Rehabilitation Needs (CARNS)

Funding of VR Services


- Services can only be funded if they are authorized in advance by VR Counselor
- Comparable Benefits
- Client may be asked to share in costs of services
- Services must be provided as cost effectively as possible
